Following this production, a donation will be made to Kingston Food Bank.

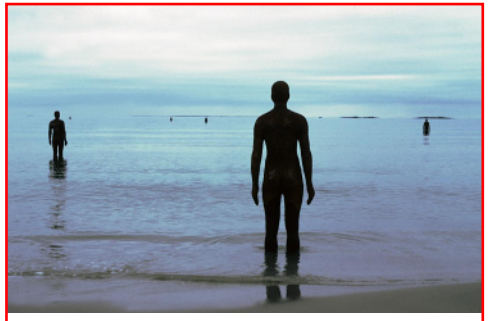
