Landirani means 'Please Receive', and this is their focus in 2013:

We have nearly reached our target to build a new Maternity Unit, which is much needed in our area. This will start in April and be complete by September. We are focusing on safe motherhood, so that we can prevent more children being born with disability in the future. We are putting in an additional 4 bicycle ambulances to our existing 8, and encouraging use by pregnant women needing to get to the unit.

We are supporting people with disability by referring them for assessments and getting equipment to assist them.

We are encouraging 'Inclusive Education' and need to encourage schools to support these pupils

We are enhancing the structures, training, resources and feeding centres at our nine Community Based Childcare Centres. Since building our first rammed earth CBCC we are growing our first sustainable food garden and want to do the same for each of ourCBCCs.

This year we will be building the first tibrary and Resource Centre in our area, bringing the written word to our community and holding Adult Literacy and Numeracy classes.

We are also building our first Training Workshop, helping people to find a way out of poverty and onto the road to self-sufficiency.
