

Following this production, a donation will be made to Kingston Churches Action on Homelessness.

KCAH supports primarily single people who are homeless, at risk of becoming homeless or who are experiencing serious problems with private landlords.



It is running a Winter Night Shelter together with seven churches in the borough in February and March for homeless people to have somewhere warm and safe to sleep, get advice and have breakfast and dinner together. They also hope to run a short notice Winter Night Shelter between now and February for when temperatures drop below zero degrees for three consecutive nights.
