Present Laughter is a comic play written by Noël Coward in 1939 but not produced until 1942 because the Second World War began while it was in rehearsal, and the British theatres closed. The title is drawn from a song "in Shakespeare's Twelfth Night that urges *carpe diem* ("present mirth hath present laughter").

The plot depicts a few days in the life of the successful and selfobsessed light comedy actor Garry

Essendine as he prepares to travel for a touring commitment in Africa. Amid a series of events bordering on farce, Garry has to deal with women who want to seduce him, placate both his long-suffering secretary and his wife, cope with a crazed young playwright, and overcome his impending mid-life crisis. The character is a caricature of the author's real-life persona, as Coward acknowledged.

As the play allows for much over-acting and confusion we considered it a suitable endeavour for the 'never-knowingly-over-rehearsed' thespians of Spring Grove Fringe and we hope you enjoy the result; if not, the bar provides a pleasant diversion as always.

All the action takes place in Garry Essendine's flat.
