Michael Frayn

Michael Frayn grew up in Ewell, was educated at Kingston Grammar School and now, aged 90, lives in Petersham with his second wife, the biographer Claire Tomalin. So we can claim him as local!

He is one of our greatest living dramatists and a versatile writer who has had both critical and commercial success as a playwright and as a novelist. He has also won a string of awards for both, though he has declined a knighthood and a CBE.



He has had an acclaimed career as a satirical journalist, on the Guardian and the Observer, and has written screenplays (including 'Clockwise' with John Cleese) as well as philosophical works. Having learned Russian during his period of national service he is Britain's finest translator of Anton Chekov!

His novels include 'Tin Men', and 'Spies'. His dramas include 'Copenhagen', 'Democracy' and farces including 'Noises Off' – described by one critic as a work which "is, was, and probably always will be the funniest play written in my life time".

Pocket Playhouse

The pieces this evening are mostly taken from Michael Frayn's 'Matchbox Theatre', 'Pocket Playhouse', and 'Magic Mobile' — three collections 'offered for performance in the smallest theatre in the world: the theatre of your own imagination'. The individual pieces are loosely connected through the topic of communication, its shortcomings and misunderstandings, talking about, talking to, talking at cross purposes. The characters may be in a play, in a book, may be you, may be us all!

We hope that you will enjoy Spring Grove Fringe's offering of these pieces on our modest – but real – stage.
