The play has been translated from America to a rather well-to-do area in Shropshire in the 1900s. The teapot of the title is a centuries-old family heirloom, much valued by the head of the house, Horace Templeton. It is central to unfolding mysteries and domestic chaos.

We follow the Templeton family, their knowing butler Chalmers, their neighbours the Burnetts, and the enigmatic Leighton, amid confusion about an inheritance, a potential marriage, and an alarming burglar.
